Wisdom from the Paschal Canon by St. John of Damascus

- Let us purify our senses, and in the unapproachable light of the resurrection we shall see Christ shining forth, and we shall clearly hear him saying 'Rejoice!', as we sing the triumphal song.
- Yesterday I was buried with you O Christ, today I rise with you as you arise. Yesterday I was crucified with you; glorify me with you, Saviour, in your Kingdom.
- O divine! O beloved! O sweetest voice! You have truly promised that you will be with us unto the end of time, O Christ. And we the faithful rejoice, having this as an anchor of hope.
- O great and most sacred Pascha, Christ! O Wisdom and Word and Power of God! Grant that we may partake of you fully in the day that has no evening of your Kingdom.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We sing "Christ is risen" and greet each other with these most encouraging words for the entire 40 days of Pascha, just as the Apostles, the disciples, the myrrhbearers, and all of the earliest Christians had the great joy of Christ's presence. This reminds us Orthodox Christians that we are Resurrection People. We live from Pascha to Pascha, from Lord's Day to Lord's Day, from dawn to dawn, and from breath to breath; we live the new life that God offers us in Christ's birth, death, and resurrection, the new life that became ours in our baptism and remains ours as we renew our baptism in our daily prayers, our readings the scriptures, our following the commandments, our living the sacramental life, as stewards, servants, and brothers and sisters. In this way, the joy of the resurrection can become more than a greeting and a song, but truly the foretaste of the eternal bliss that we long for. Walking in the Steps of the American Saints

BE A PRAYER WARRIOR

St. Herman came to Russian America with the Valaam mission in 1794 and ended up settling on a little island - Spruce Island - just far enough from the colonial capital of Kodiak to establish his monastery, "New Valaam," yet close enough to have an orphanage and offer spiritual protection to the Aleuts. On June 20th, 1820, St. Herman wrote a letter to his friend and benefactor, which includes the following marvelous and insight advice that we would do well to incorporate into our lives:



"A sin for a person loving God is nothing more than an arrow fired by an enemy during battle. The true Christian is a warrior, fighting his way through hosts of unseen foes to his place in Heaven. For, in the words of the Apostle, Our Kingdom is in Heaven, and about the warrior he says: our battle is not with flesh and blood, but with ideas and authorities."

Ask Abouna

Previous Question: Fr. James, please discuss the Gifts of the Holy Spirit.

Answer: In contemporary Christianity there is a group of churches that goes under the name of "pentecostal," meaning that they not only invoke the Holy Spirit but manifest the "gifts" of the Holy Spirit, particularly speaking in tongues. In fact some pentecostal churches even maintain that a person has not received the Spirit unless he speaks in tongues (that is, being given the grace to speak fluently in a language one does not know or may never have even heard).



Although the Apostles received the gift of tongues on the day of Pentecost (Acts 2:4-11), St Paul was ambivalent about speaking in tongues. In 1 Corinthians 14 he says that prophecy is superior to speaking in tongues, wishing to speak five words with understanding - "that I may teach others also" - than ten thousand words in tongues (1 Cor 14:19).

St Paul believes that there are many gifts of the Spirit - to one may be given wisdom, to another prophecy, to another healing, to another the working of miracles, but as he says in 1 Corinthians 13, no matter what one does, if one does it without love it is nothing. All gifts must be permeated with the spirit of love, the greatest of all the virtues.

And when St Paul contrasts the gifts of the Spirit with the works of the flesh (fornication, idolatry, hatred, murder, envy, drunkenness, to name a few!), he lists love first. "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control" (Galatians 5:22). These are the true gifts of the Holy Spirit, acquired by us only through prayer, fasting and, above all, by God's grace. The reason for the existence of the sacraments, services, the Holy Eucharist, Akathists, preaching, anointing, etc. - all the work of the Orthodox Church - is that each and every one of us might know the Holy Spirit. What we all acquired at our Chrismation - the gift of the Holy Spirit - we must manifest throughout our lives.

At the beginning of the Divine Liturgy the priests prays for the Holy Spirit to fill us: "O Heavenly King, the Comforter, Spirit of truth who art everywhere present and fillest all things, treasury of good things and giver of life: come and abide in us, to cleanse us from every stain and to save our souls, O Good One."

May the feast of Holy Pentecost (June 23 this year) fill you more and more with the Holy Spirit, that you might be Apostles of the Gospel at all times and to all people!
