St John Maximovich, who passed into eternal life in Seattle on July 2nd, 1966, was a brilliant and erudite, yet simple, joyful, and very fruitful servant of God's Church. After studies in Serbia, he dedicated his life to monasticism as well as the pastoral ministries of prayer, teaching, preaching, building churches, and caring for orphans. This took him from Ukraine to Shanghai to the Philippines to Europe and finally to San Francisco. His letter to a young man seeking direction for his life and career, is a strong reminder for us to "answer the call" for ministry, whether it be our life's work or part of our parish involvement:

"When I meet and observe the lives of those whom I knew as young people and who have now reached a ripe age, I see how weighed down they are with worldly cares and sicknesses, how bleakly they spend their days if they have no higher yearnings. But those who give themselves to God's service, even if they suffer for it, are spiritually vibrant and feel God's hand protecting them."

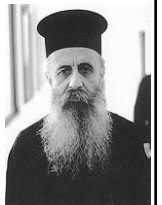
Many thanks to all for your contribution to our June collection. We collected & delivered numerous paper products! In July, we are collecting **Oral Care products.**

Previous Question: Fr. Noah, tell me about **Vespers**. Why is it important?

Answer: Vespers, from the Latin for "evening," has been an essential element in the life of God's people since the Creation (Genesis 1:5). In the Old Testament, Vespers is primarily about kindling and tending the "evening light" and the accompanying incense offering (Ex 30:8, Lev 24:1-4, 1 Chr 23:30). The evening light was an important source of protection, hope, productivity, and joy in ancient cultures.



Psalm 140/141:2 has poetically and prayerfully captured this, is one of the most beloved Lenten hymn sung at the Presanctified Liturgy: "Let my prayer arise in your sight as incense and let the lifting up of my hands be an evening sacrifice."

The themes of our Orthodox Vespers service (Creation: Psalm 103/104; Fall: The "Lord I Cry Psalms" 141/140, 142/141, and 129/128; and Redemption: Gladsome Light as well as the "Hymn of St. Simeon," Luke 2:29-32) are a magnificent context for the rich hymnography for the feasts and saints.

It was at the (evening) offering of incense that Zacharias heard the good news of the birth of John, the forerunner of the Messiah. It was at the evening offering of incense that Judith (Chapter 9, of the Septuagint/Greek Old Testament) begged God for strength before she struck out on her desperate and risky mission to save Jerusalem. It was with the prayer at the lighting of the lamp that St. Macrina prayed deeply with thanksgiving and then breathed her last. It has been at Vespers that many saints and faithful people have sifted through their consciences. It is on the eves of the Lord's Day and the Feasts that we are called to rekindle the fire of God's love in our hearts in preparation for offering the sacrifice of praise in the Liturgy.

Vespers is, perhaps, the best service to bring someone to church. Glory to God! It was at Vespers that I met my dear wife all those years ago in Alaska! I'm sure glad I didn't stay home that night!

New Question: Fr. Noah, how long have you been serving at St. Philip's?

Recipe: Blueberry Dumplings

Dumplings

- 2 cups flour
- 1 teaspoon sugar
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 3/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 cup vegetable shortening
- 6-8 tablespoons milk

Stewed Blueberries

- 2 cups blueberries
- 1/2 cup water
- 1/4 cup sugar
- Heavy cream



Bring the blueberries, water and sugar to a boil in a wide pan.

Mix together the flour, sugar, salt and baking powder. Cut in the shortening with a pastry cutter or two knives until the mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Gently mix in milk until it becomes a very soft dough.

Divide the dough into about five dumplings and drop on top of the blueberries. Lower heat to a simmer and cover the pan tightly. Steam for 12 minutes. Serve warm, drizzled with cold heavy cream.
