Watermelon Sorbet

- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/2 cup light corn syrup or light agave nectar (*the syrup or nectar makes the resulting texture quite smooth*)
- 1/4 cup freshly squeezed lime or lemon juice
- 3 fresh mint leaves
- 3 pounds watermelon, rind and seeds removed, cut into chunks



1. In a small saucepan, bring the sugar, corn syrup or agave nectar, lime or lemon juice, and mint to a boil, stirring until the sugar dissolves. Remove from the heat and let cool.
2. In a blender, puree half of the watermelon chunks. Strain through a fine-mesh strainer into a large bowl. Repeat with the remaining watermelon.
3. Add the slightly cooled syrup to the watermelon and mix well. Place in a 2-quart container, cover, and freeze for 3 to 4 hours. Flake the mixture with a fork. Scoop it up and serve in pretty bowls.

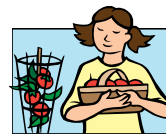

Previous Question: Fr. Noah, how long have you been serving at St. Philip's?

Answer: Glory to God for these seven years! There are some things I regret, of course, the mistakes of youth, and I ask for everyone's forgiveness. But, these have been wonderful years of growth for me, my family, and the parish. Glory to God! We've made it very strongly through the priest-transition (never an easy process) in the midst of a severe recession. We've continued the patterns that Fr. Boniface and the founders of the parish laid down (beautiful worship, excellent and effective educational and outreach programs and ministries, strong stewardship, continued mission and monastery support, well-maintained facilities, welcoming atmosphere) as well as completed some projects (nave iconography, choir closet) and broken some ground (food festival, outreach collection). We've buried or said good bye to some dear parishioners and have welcomed many new families. We have updated many administrative and communication processes, including a resource-rich website and email-based bulletins. In addition to our regular youth programs, we've sent many children to summer camp and on mission trips. We are bearing fruit to the glory of God!

Pure in heart, they beheld the image of God.

As peacemakers, they became God's children.

Persecuted and tortured for righteousness' sake, they now rejoice in heaven;

And they pray fervently to the Lord to have mercy on our souls.
