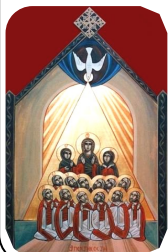

ASCENSION: The ascent of Christ to heaven forty days after his Resurrection.

PENTECOST: Fifty days after Christ's Resurrection the Holy Spirit was poured out upon the disciples. Through the Sacrament of Chrismation, Orthodox Christians experience their own personal Pentecost. Every Divine Liturgy becomes a Pentecost through the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the faithful, and upon the gifts of bread and wine, transforming them into the Body and Blood of Christ.

Previous Question: Tell me a little about the newly-canonized Saint Paisios.



Answer: Saint Paisios the Athonite (1924-1994) was born in Turkey and raised in Greece as a carpenter. After military service, he lived the monastic life in mainland Greece, on Mount Sinai, and finally on Mount Athos. He was a devout ascetic, whose gentle manner and acceptance of those who came to receive his counsel and blessing endeared him to his visitors, and who has become one of the most beloved of spiritual fathers.

He lived and embodied these most profound words on the spiritual life:

"One word of a humble and spiritually-experienced man that is painfully born from the depths of his heart has greater worth than a bunch of clever sayings of an external man that come out quickly from his educated mouth. His words don't speak truth to the souls of men, for they are fleshly words and not the flames of the fire of Pentecost."

May we have his prayers.
