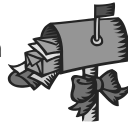
CHRISTMAS IN JULY GREETINGS

NEWSPAPERS: Salfid Rescue Kennel, our neighbor on Clearview Road, is always in need of old newspapers. Look for the box in the hallway.

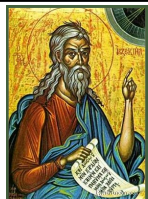

Literacy:

Old Testament Prophet Ezekiel



This great prophet spoke of judgment and also restoration. He acted out many of his messages about God's sovereignty. His call to ministry came in a vision of four angels with faces of a man, a lion, ox, and eagle surrounding the radiance of the Spirit. This is one of the scriptural roots of the phrase introducing the Angelic Hymn in the Liturgy: "Singing the Triumphant Hymn, shouting, proclaiming and saying... ." Dust off your Bibles, discuss the wonderful and terrible works of God with your families, and ask me, Fr. James, or Dn. Herman if you have any questions.

Wisdom

On Obedience,
by St. Silouan of Mt. Athos

- + Obedience is necessary not only for monks, but for all people. Even the Lord was obedient. The proud and self-assured do not let grace reside within them, and therefore they never have internal peace, whereas the soul of the obedient easily accepts the grace of the Holy Spirit, bringing with it joy and serenity.
- + Whoever carries in him even a small amount of grace will submit to leadership with great joy. He knows that the Lord controls heaven and earth and the netherworld, and his own self, and his affairs and all that exists in the world, and for this reason he is always at peace.
- + Obedience prevents pride. In return for obedience you receive the ability to pray, along with the grace of the Holy Spirit. This is why obedience is greater than fasting and prayer.
- + If the fallen angels had retained obedience, they would have stayed in the heavens and would glorify the name of the Lord to this day. And if Adam had retained obedience, then he and his issue would have remained in Eden.

Holy Ascension Update



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,
Blessed Pentecost!

We at Holy Ascension, your daughter parish, were so blessed to see a number of you at our Titular Feast of our Lord's Ascension! I was greatly encouraged to be able to concelebrate the divine services with Fr. Noah and Fr. James, as well as with our new deacon! During Lent Sayedna Thomas visited our parish and ordained Nicholas Reid to the Diaconate. He and his wife, Sh. Beth, have five children and are a huge blessing to our parish. Dn. Nicholas completed the St. Stephen's course with a focus on the sacred art of Byzantine Chant, and has been regularly meeting with our Sbdn. Vladimir and a few others to develop our chanting skills.

Having sold our 10-acre property in Malvern, we are now putting in place a long term campus development plan at our existing location in West Chester. We are meeting with architects this summer as we obtain approvals for public sewer access. Our plans are to build a larger church hall initially, and then, some years later come back and build a Temple. We are especially desiring to make our parish a home for our people: a place where we can all come together and worship, share in the agape meal after liturgy, and fellowship; offering mutual encouragement and an opportunity to share our experiences working out our faith.

This summer we are expecting a number of significant events as we have four babies waiting to be born, and four engaged young couples. We continue to welcome a number of college students from Eastern University and West Chester University who are exploring Orthodoxy or more fully embracing the faith passed to them by their families. Thank God we have a number of mature senior folks in the community who are our pillars and keeping us all on track!
