NON-PERISHABLE FOOD COLLECTION: We continue to collect non-perishables of all kinds for the food pantries.

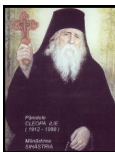
NEWSPAPERS: Salfid Rescue Kennel, our neighbor on Clearview Road, is always in need of old newspapers. Look for the box in the hallway.

Previous Question: What has been the fruit of the festival?


Answer: Well, Glory to God! We are preparing for our 6th annual International Food Festival.

The fruit of the festival has been manifold. Let me recount the goals for the festival and then we can see the fruit based on that.

1. Reach out to the local community ... so people know what the "gold dome off 309" means.
 - a. This has been done. Our church is known in the greater Souderton area, not just for tasty food, but also joy, hospitality, our beautiful temple, beautiful choir, and loving community of parishioners.
 - b. People in our neighborhood greet me warmly all the time.
 - c. Each of us has a specific and low pressure way to invite people to the church.
 - d. One local clergyman told me that I was the best evangelist in the area after he came through our church tour. While that is obviously overstated, it shows that we have reached the goal.
2. Build up our own parish community ... so people in the church get to know each other.
 - a. This has been a beautiful surprise for me. I love beholding everyone working together.


Challenge for 2017:
Be led by the Spirit, not pushed by the passions
(Romans 8:12-14)

Their passion smolders all night; in the morning it blazes like a flaming fire. - Hosea 7:6b



Passions are good desires that have been misdirected, like the Holy Prophet Hosea's important word picture. A camp or cook fire is a good thing, but if it is left unattended it could turn into a wild fire all too quickly. With this in mind, redouble your efforts in vigilance as our Lord tells the disciples: "watch and pray lest you enter into temptation" Matthew 26:41.

Truly, it is never too early, or too late, to start putting out a fire. Lord, help me to keep the flame of love and life in you burning brightly, but not burning others!



b. It has been nice to hear of friendships developing between people who have known each other for years but never made the opportunity to get to know each other.

3. Give back to the local community ... we have been supporting local charities.
 - a. Manna on Main Street
 - b. Keystone Opportunity Center
 - c. Pennridge Fish
4. Support the special projects of our parish.
 - a. Since the festival is not "about the money" it has stayed beautiful and joyful.
 - b. Our stewardship program has thrived since we started the festival. Some were afraid that people's tithes, pledges, and offerings would suffer, but, Glory to God! it hasn't happened.

I am very thankful to the many people who have labored over the years to make this a successful annual evangelical event. May God grant all who labor for the gospel to do so in peace, joy, prosperity, health, and zeal for many years and then a rich entrance into the Kingdom of Heaven.
