BEAUTIFICATION UPDATE

- The major iconography of the nave of our temple has been completed with the recent installation of the beautiful Dormition Mural on the West Wall.



- The Prothesis Table and Table of Needs (in the altar area) have been beautified with stylized depictions of the Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem (on the left, framing the icon of the Nativity) and the Church of the Holy Sepulchre (on the right, framing the icon of the Resurrection).

- The icon of St. Andrew Rublev the Iconographer has been installed in the narthex, initiating the process of illuminating this sacred space with standing saints. Once the Beautification Team develops their approach to this phase, they will be soliciting input and donations for these icons.

- We are working with a local craftsman to design and build a tomb and icon stands that will match the interior of our beautiful temple.



Parish Trivia ...

Previous Question: Why do we celebrate the Exaltation of the Cross?

Answer: The Synaxarion for this Great Feast, celebrated on September 14th, says: "On this day, we commemorate two events connected with the Precious Cross of Christ: the finding of the Cross on Golgotha, and the returning of the Cross to Jerusalem from Persia. While in the Holy Land, the Empress Helena learned that the Holy Cross was buried underneath the temple of the pagan goddess Venus built on Golgotha. She demanded it be torn down and the Cross be excavated. The search turned up three crosses. Uncertain which was the true Cross, the Patriarch Marcarius ordered that each cross be placed on the corpse in a funeral procession passing by. The first two produced nothing, but the third brought the man back to life, thus determining that this was the very Cross on which our Savior brought life to the world. Later, King Chozroes conquered Jerusalem, took the people into slavery and carried off the Lord's Cross to Persia. In 628, the Greek Emperor Heraclius defeated Chozroes, and brought the Cross back to Jerusalem with great ceremony. Heraclius was carrying the Cross on his back when, suddenly, he froze. The Patriarch Zacharias saw an angel directing the emperor to take off his robes and walk with the same extreme humility with which our Savior bore His Cross. The emperor complied, and was able to finish the procession to the Church of the Resurrection on Golgotha, where he restored the Holy Cross. By the power of Thy Cross, O Lord Jesus Christ our God, have mercy upon us, and save us. Amen."
