NON-PERISHABLE FOOD COLLECTION: We continue to collect non-perishables of all kinds for the food pantries as well.

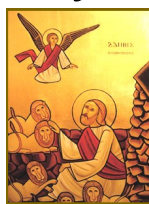
NEWSPAPERS: Salfid Rescue Kennel, our neighbor on Clearview Road, is always in need of old newspapers. Look for the box in the hallway.

Old Testament Prophet Daniel



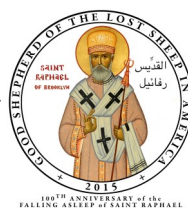

Sacred Life vs. Consumerism

I am very disturbed by the recent exposures of the procurement and selling of baby body parts by Planned Parenthood. Please pray with me for our nation to wake up to the sanctity of life and put an end to these atrocious acts. These are sometimes justified by the medical myth of embryonic stem cells but below is the reality check:

Dr. Michelle Cretella, president of the **American College of Pediatricians**, says, "Fetal tissue research, like embryonic stem cell research, has failed to produce a single successful treatment for human disease, and both have been associated with significant side-effects including overgrowth of cells and the need for immunosuppressive chemotherapy.

"Adult stem cell research, in contrast, has yielded treatments for 73 different diseases including several forms of cancer, diabetes, Parkinson's, cardiac disease, autoimmune illnesses and more. Adult stem cells do not overgrow or require immunosuppression, and most importantly, they do not require the killing of innocent human life."

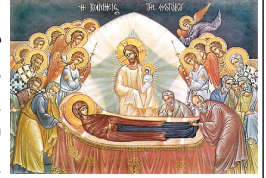

Previous Question: Tell me about the Dormition Fast.

Answer: The Dormition fast has been kept since at least the year 450 (St. Leo the Great



mentions it). St. Symeon of Thessalonica (early 15th Century) writes, "The fast in August was established in honor of the Mother of God the Word; Who, foreknowing Her repose, ascetically labored and fasted for us as always, although She was holy and immaculate, and had no need for fasting. Thus, She especially prayed for us in preparation for being transported from this life to the future life, when Her blessed soul would be united through the Divine Spirit with Her Son. Therefore, we also should fast and praise Her, emulating Her life, urging Her thereby to pray for us."

This ancient holy time is a gift from God for us to draw near to Him and also to the Panagia. Don't neglect the fast or the feasts!
