A Navy Chaplain, he is currently stationed with Combat Logistics Battalion 11 (CLB 11) at Camp Pendleton, California. CLB 11 is part of the 11th Marine Expeditionary Unit (11th MEU). The mission of the MEU is to provide geographic combatant commanders with a forward-deployed, rapid-response force capable of conducting conventional amphibious and selected maritime special operations at night or under adverse weather conditions from the sea, by surface and/or by air while under communications and electronics restrictions. Fr. Joseph will be deploying later this year with the 11th MEU. Fr. Joseph and family will be moving to Norfolk, VA in the summer of 2017. Please keep Fr. Joseph, Kh. With this in mind, I am thankful that our life does not end in the grave, and am thankful to remain

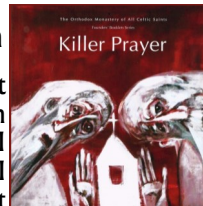

Have you ever looked at your prayer book with the distinct feeling of 'I hate you, I hate you, I hate you?' Have you felt totally useless spiritually, unable to move forward for one tiny step? Do you, in fact, feel that you are going backwards, rather than advancing in any way; that your prayer life is worse today than yesterday, and definitely worse than a year ago? Well, in that case, rejoice, for this is the sure sign that your prayer is working.

By prayer, our saints say, we get closer to God; unfortunately, getting closer to God means we have to get closer to ourselves first, closer to our own hearts, because that is where Christ reveals Himself – and getting to know one's own heart is nasty business; getting to know who you really are is never fun, never a fulfilling or comforting experience.

When your prayer kills you on the inside, let it. And give thanks. When your prayer exposes the small person that you are in front of your own conscience, let it. And give thanks.

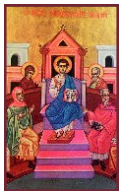

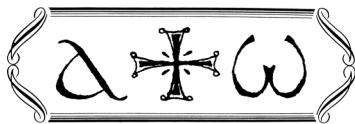

Baby Steps to Holiness

May - Read a Book of the Bible

I hear about people’s low points in life quite often. “Father, help me... I don't know what to do... How should I respond to such and such. I can't bear the insults any longer...”

We are constantly battered by the waves on the stormy sea of life. Because of that, we need to be anchored to the Rock of Faith, in the daily reading of the Holy Scriptures... Read one book of the Bible and enjoy and be edified by the way that the Apostle or Prophet by divine inspiration chose to deliver God's message. Don't know where to start? Here are some suggestions:



Gospel of John or Acts of the Apostles. (These are read liturgically during the 40 days of Pascha). Or, something shorter: James, 1 John, or Philippians.

We'll find answers to our questions and comfort in our sorrows in the faithful reading of God's Word. May it be blessed!

**Challenge for 2016:
Pray Without Ceasing
(1 Thessalonians 5)**

Go to Church. Say Your Prayers. Remember God. This three-point Babushka Sermon is all we need: Going to Church aligns us with all the saints and angels. Saying your prayers offers each day to God. Remembering God offers each moment to God. Remember God means with thanksgiving and fear, with love and respect, with hope and trust.

Previous Question: What is the “Paschal Vortex”?

Answer: The Paschal Vortex, a new and friendly phrase of mine, is the time from Sundays prior to the Preparation for Great Lent , Lent, Holy Week, Great and Holy Pascha, Bright Week, Mid-Pentecost, the Leave-taking of Pascha, Ascension, Pentecost, and All Saints Sunday. Any Orthodox Christian who takes the Great Fast and the Feast of Feasts seriously will know what this means. It is the swirling-whirling moving of the Holy Spirit in the fasts and feasts and celebrations of the great text-books of repentance and rejoicing, the Triodion and Pentecostarion. It is the “Divine Undertow” dragging us further into the depths of God’s love for us. It is consuming. It is exhausting. It is in the way of our worldly pursuits. Yet, it is refreshing. It is rejuvenating. It raises our horizons from earth to heaven.

New Question: How, and why, do we celebrate Pascha for 40 Days?
