A Message from Fr Noah

Dear Saint Philip's Family,

Our Lenten Journey to Holy Pascha is nearing its climax. We are purposely exiling ourselves from comforts as we pilgrimage with Christ to the Holy City to share in his passion, death, burial, and resurrection.

These words of St. John of Damascus that are part of the Paschal Canon (Ode Three) summarize our efforts and our longing: "Yesterday I was buried with you O Christ, today I rise with you as you arise. Yesterday I was crucified with you; glorify me with you, Saviour, in your Kingdom."

Join me and Orthodox Christians throughout the world and throughout history in drawing near to Christ, our most humble and loving Lord, in Whom is our Hope for Eternal Life.

Challenge for 2017: Be led by the Spirit, not pushed by the passions (Romans 8:12-14)

PASSIONS, LIKE VIRTUES, are also interconnected, just as "links of a single chain" (St. Isaac of Nitria), one being an offshoot of another. There are eight of them; in the order of birth they are as follows 1) gluttony, 2) lust, 3) avarice, 4) anger, 5) despondency, 6) despair, 7) vainglory, and 8) pride.

The main concern of patristic asceticism is not with external manifestations of sin, nor individual instances of sin, but rather with their cause, i.e., the vices and passions rooted in the soul, or diseases of the soul and hidden inner states of sin.

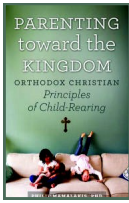
May it be blessed for the refining of our lives, our families, our church, and our country ever more into the image of God.

Start or join a book club and endeavor to discuss meaningful issues as they come up.

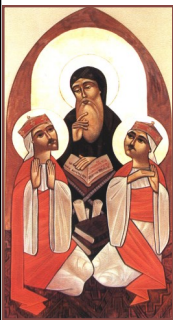
Wisdom
