A Message from Fr Noah

Dear Saint Philip's Family, Hosanna in the Highest!

We had an amazing Lenten retreat recently on "A Christian Ending." Dn. Mark Barna gave us a very practical, pointed, and poetic reminder about something that our modern society even Orthodox Christians—has forgotten. He spoke about caring for the elderly, how to manage a church funeral, how to work with a funeral director, and how and why to prepare a body of a loved one for burial, and how to keep vigil over the departed. I'm thankful to say that this has sparked a group who are working to set up a Burial Ministry Team. Jonathan Y, Stephanie M, and Martha M are the master-planners. They are also looking for parishioners who can help with visiting the ailing, reading Psalms, preparing and transporting the holy remains of our brothers and sisters in Christ, as well as lots of behind-thescenes administrative tasks.

Another product of the retreat is the formation of an excellent compendium of legal documents regarding end-of-life and post-death care, that will be a gift to our loved-ones. The church office will be making these available shortly.

I know our modern culture distracts us from considering and preparing for death, but that is not the Orthodox Christian way. We remember our death with faith, hope, and love, with the conviction that our Lord Jesus Christ has trampled down death by His death. Indeed, this is the only lasting joy!

Christ is risen! Indeed, He is risen!

- "O Heavenly King" is not said or sung until Pentecost. Instead, we say or sing the Resurrection Troparion three


Did You Know?

The Liturgy Never Ends.

Ahhh! Those beautiful words coming from his gospel lips, which we are confident will be resurrected on the last day to join the heavenly choir. Of course in earthly terms this doesn't make sense. We begin with "blessed is the Kingdom" around 10 a.m. and end an hour and a half later with the final "Amen." But in spiritual terms this is true in two senses, though. First, our earthly liturgies are just us "dipping in" to the forever flowing stream of life and light that is God's Kingdom, which we hope will engulf our whole lives. Indeed, we call our services "Divine", rather than "holy", because they are God's—God's love-gift to us so that we can be renewed in His Image. Secondly, we leave our lovely temple and go out to do His work: to have the good news of Jesus Christ on our lips, have peace in our hearts, good works in our hands... After all, the word "Liturgy" is Greek for "the work of the people"!
