

## Knowing, Praying, Living the Holy Scriptures

“How I have loved thy law, O Lord! The whole day it is my meditation.” (Ps 118:97)

### Judges 5:7

“The mighty of Israel failed, they came to an end; Until Deborah, whom He raised; Until a mother whom He raised in Israel.” (OSB)

Having embarked on a course through the Book of Judges, the reader will soon discover, no doubt, that this Book is not for the faint of heart. After the model judge, Othniel, in Judg 3:7-11 which sets the pattern for the stories of the judges to follow, the reader encounters two of the more gruesome and memorable stories in Scripture—Ehud’s assassination of the portly king of Moab, Eglon, whose girth is such that Ehud cannot extract his sword from the king’s gut (3:12-30), and Jael’s assassination (herself a Canaanite) of the Canaanite general, Sisera, by driving a tent peg through his temple (4:17-24).



While these events are indeed presented as God-given victories, we would not be wrong to hear in them some ambivalence, as it were. That is, even in victory, the Scriptural accounts are not altogether “celebratory,” but do have a tragic undertone to them. Certainly we are to see the destruction of God’s enemies as a good thing, and yet we are reminded that the ongoing conflicts between Israel and the people of Canaan are a result of Israel’s failure to complete the conquest of the Promised Land and their ongoing wickedness before the Lord. While the continued Canaanite presence is ultimately explained in terms of God’s providence—God kept some Canaanites in the land so as to “test” Israel (Judg 3:1-6)—this in no way absolves Israel of blame, for in their forgetting of God and courting of evil they clearly fail the test. Israel, having abandoned the narrow and noble path of fidelity to God, must resort to trickery and subterfuge in the person of the judges.

The judge and prophetess Deborah sounds this note of tragedy when she announces to Barak, an Israelite general from the tribe of Benjamin, as he prepares to go against King Jabin and his general, Sisera, “there will be no honor gained by you on the journey you are undertaking, for the Lord will sell Sisera into the hand of a woman” (Judg 4:9).

And yet, in all of this do we not hear an anticipation of our Lord’s victorious incarnation, death, and resurrection, accomplished through His willing self-emptying unto the shameful death on the Cross, as well as through the humility and lowliness of Our Lady, the Virgin Mary (Lk 1:46-55)? God Himself descends into our lowliness and dishonor, brought about through our own disobedience, and inverts them, turning them into manifestations of His own glory and self-giving love. Thus we arrive at the irony that “Through the Cross, joy has come into all the world.” In the words of St. John Chrysostom:

“Christ conquered the devil using the same weapons that the devil used against us: A virgin, a tree, and death. These tokens of our demise have now become tokens of our victory. Instead of Eve there was Mary; instead of the tree of knowledge of good and evil, the wood of the Cross; instead of Adam’s death, the death of Christ.”
